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Why do I need "Academic Skills"?

Academic skills are the skills that ESRs need to increase their level of academic preparedness prior to commencement of their studies in the SEPOMO consortium and – who knows – to become a successful academic

SEPOMO ESRs need to able to

- find the relevant literature, critically read and analyze it
- reflect on scientific ethics and integrity of their research
- compose a (publishable!) paper based on the results obtained
- deliver a scientific presentation on their research at international conferences

Academic skills are **general skill**s which do not depend on a particular project In this respect, they are different from project-oriented specific skills

What Will I Learn?

- 1. Translate a specific question or topic into a targeted literature search
- 2. Extract the needed information from the scientific papers effectively and quickly
- 3. **Structure a paper** in a coherent way, know where to put/find different types of information and figures
- 4. Present the discussions on the scientific content by evidence based arguments
- 5. Distinguish between 'plagiarism' and 'good academic practice'
- 6. Build up a scientific presentation based on the research results
- 7. Deliver a presentation with proper visual impact and deal with questions
- 8. **Apply Academic Integrity Guidelines** concerning plagiarism, data management, research analysis & reporting etc

What Competences Will I Acquire?

- how **to apply** a coherent **strategy** for searching the scientific literature online and using research databases

- developing critical thinking by reading and interpretation of scientific papers
- clear and concise writing of scientific manuscripts including plotting of graphs
- transferring the scientific content into well-organized talks with appropriate visual impact, including critical self-reflection
- understanding academic integrity and the need for it
